

Treatment Key:

1	Direct	Diagnostic testing such as blood glucose testing, vital signs, etc.
2	Direct	Insertion and sterile irrigation of catheters
3	Direct	Dressings and wound care
4	Direct	Chest wall manipulation-inhalation therapy, suctioning, postural drainage, etc.
5	Direct	Positioning and range of motion exercises
6	Direct	Oral medication dispensing and/or complex medication administration such as injection, nasal, rectal, intravenous, etc.
7	Direct	Tracheotomy care, oxygen administration, ventilator care
8	Direct	Administering enteral and intravenous total parenteral nutrition
9	Direct	Assessments and evaluations to determine medical/mental health-related status, identify actual and potential medical/mental health-related needs, planning for nursing and PCA activities, or referral to other SBAP service providers or the IEP team
10	Direct	Observation for adverse medication reactions and educating the student about medications.
11	Direct	Medical/mental health education provided to students related to health status and treatment. For example, teaching a student self-catheterization or self-blood glucose testing, how to determine the amount of insulin needed, and giving self- injections.
12	Direct	Monitoring the incidence and prevalence of designated health problems or medical conditions, e.g., seizure precautions or extreme lethargy
13	Direct	Hands-on assistance, cueing, or supervision of medical/mental health-related service. Activities may include catheterizations, suctioning, oxygen admin, and tube feedings.
14	Direct	Other Direct Service

Notes:

- The Treatment Key should not be considered an all-inclusive list. Providers may use “Other Direct Service” but must provide a clear description of the service in their comments.
- All Direct Services must be face-to-face with the student in order to be compensable through the School-Based ACCESS Program.
- Nursing Services must be provided on a one-to-one basis in order to be compensable through the School-Based ACCESS Program.
